Assignment Title: Term Paper on *the assigned topic*

Length: 1000 words ($\pm 10\%$)

Deadline: 16.05.2025 11:59 p.m.

Submission Format: Register for my Turnitin class. Use 1.5 spacing, 12-point Times New Roman, 1-inch margins. Submit your paper as a Word document on Turnitin with quotes under 10% similarity. Remember that the term papers will not be accepted via e-mail.

Assignment Requirements

1. Content:

- Address the assigned topic, provided by the instructor.
- Develop a clear thesis and support it with well-analysed quotes from the assigned novel. Focus only on the parts of the novel related to your assigned topic; avoid summarizing the entire story. Use quotes (direct or paraphrased) only from the assigned novel, and do not include secondary sources.
- Integrate your personal reflections to connect the assigned text's themes, characters, or ideas to your perspective.

2. Structure:

- **Title:** Create a clear, engaging, and descriptive title for your paper.
- **Introduction:** Present your thesis and outline your main points.
- **Body:** Analyse the assigned text using quotes and examples, but blending textual evidence with your personal reflections (your viewpoint is of utmost importance).
- **Conclusion:** Summarize your key arguments and provide a broader reflection on the assigned topic.

3. Citation:

- Use proper citation style (APA 7th edition) for all quotes from the assigned novel.

Tips for Success

- Balance analysis and personal reflection without overusing quotes.
- Paraphrase when appropriate to stay within the quote limit.
- Proofread for clarity and ensure the originality of your work.

Evaluation Criteria

- **Thesis and Argument:** Originality and clarity of your thesis.
- **Textual Evidence:** Effective use of quotes (within 10% limit) and analysis.
- **Personal Reflection:** Insightful integration of reflections.
- **Title:** Creative and descriptive title that reflects the paper's thesis and focus.
- **Structure and Organization:** Clear introduction, body, and conclusion with logical flow.
- **Writing Quality:** Academic tone, grammar, and coherence.
- **Citation and Formatting:** Proper citation and adherence to guidelines.
